"Our store, honestly, is a tired old shoe, so we're making it something special," President [Kirk Hubbard](#), III, told PBN. "It's one of the coolest buildings downtown. It's a great historic building — that's where the Honolulu Star-Bulletin did their printing."

The store will close temporarily next month during renovations and is holding a blowout sale throughout April.

Reyn Spooner was recently named the official designer for the 2015 and 2017 Transpacific Yacht Race.

The company also operates a newly relocated **Sheraton Waikiki** store, a 50-year-old **Ala Moana Center** store and a 40-year-old Kahala Mall store.
